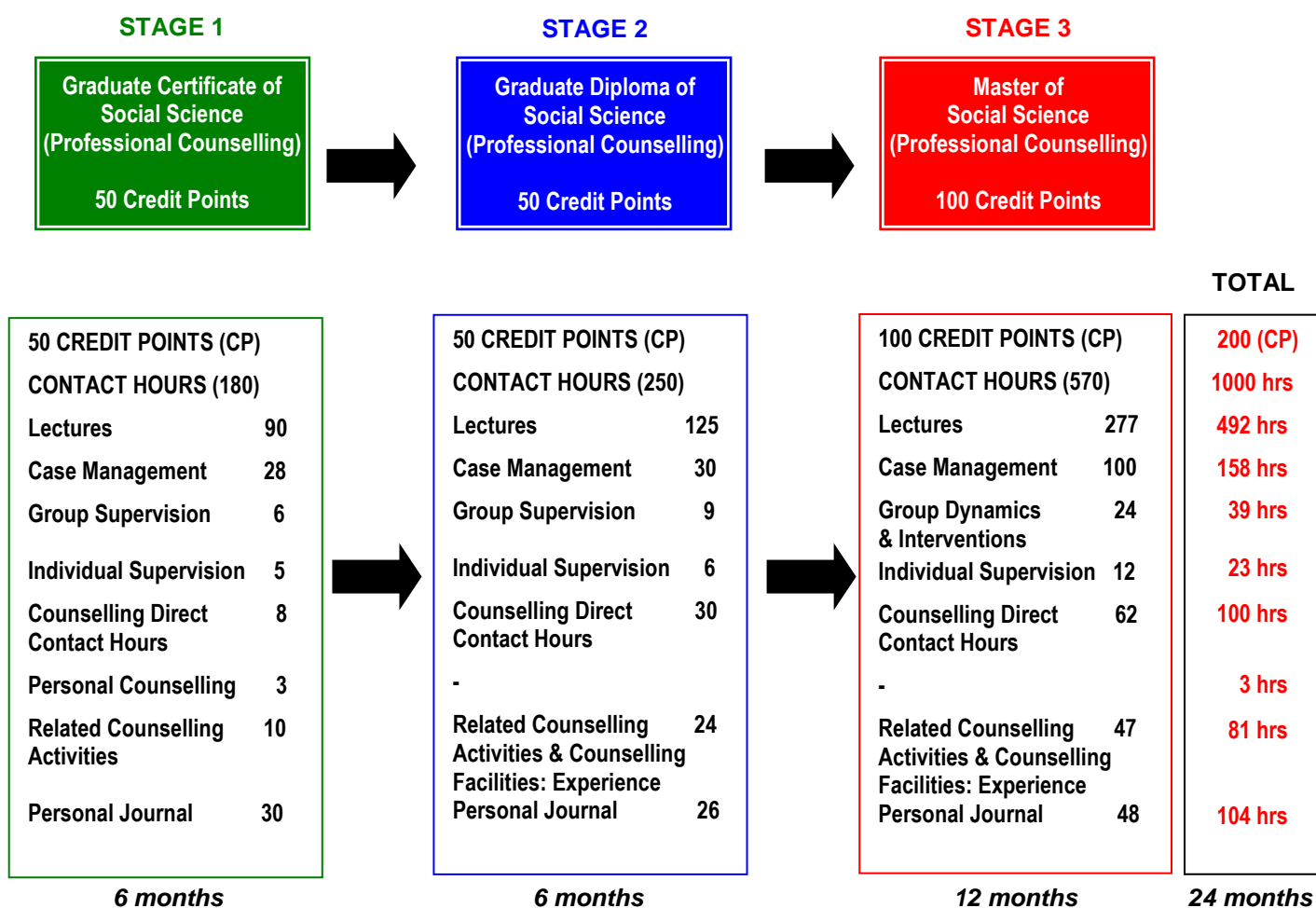

STAGE 1:

A 6-month programme, consisting of 4 subjects and totalling "180" contact hours

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

All applicants should demonstrate appropriate motivation and commitment for participation in the course and supply evidence of appropriate opportunities for counselling practice and supervision.

All applicants will be assessed for suitability through an interview, submission of an essay of 200 words on why they are choosing to develop their counselling theories and skills, and submission of one character reference (the referee should have good knowledge of the applicant's work).

Exemptions will be granted where an equivalent postgraduate level subject has been successfully completed at a recognized tertiary institution during the last five years. Recognition of prior learning will be granted where a student provides supported documentary evidence of relevant work experience during the last seven years.

COURSE FEES (6-Month programme)

S\$6,400 (exclusive of GST) covers the Swinburne University online journal, tuition fees, study materials, individual and group supervisions, personal counselling, professional indemnity and graduation (in Singapore). The fees do not include Counselling Related Activities.

Course fees are payable either in full or in 3 instalments.

A registration and administrative fee is payable when you submit your application for the Graduate Certificate of Social Science (Professional Counselling).

Applicants who possess a degree or post-graduate degree will be enrolled into the Master of Social Science (Professional Counselling).

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

This programme is an extension of the existing **Graduate Certificate of Social Science (Professional Counselling)** and the **Graduate Diploma of Social Science (Professional Counselling)** that are accredited and awarded by Swinburne University of Technology.

Applicants can be accepted directly into the Masters course in recognition of prior learning if they have completed a Postgraduate Diploma in Counselling from Swinburne University of Technology; or another recognised university or equivalent institution. Exemptions can be granted to a maximum of 50% of the nested suite of courses.

The above criteria will be assessed on a case-to-case basis and will be subject to the Executive Counselling and Training Academy’s Board decision and approved by the Academic Leader of the Psychology Discipline within the Faculty of Life and Social Sciences.

Selection is based on an interview and the applicant’s suitability for the course as determined by personal suitability as well as academic and work experience. Each applicant will be expected to provide: evidence of a high standard of performance at Graduate Diploma level, one referee report, evidence of appropriate supervised counselling experience and a written statement of their reasons for wishing to undertake the programme

COURSE FEES (12-Month programme)

\$\$15,600 (exclusive of GST) covers the Swinburne University online journal, tuition fees, study materials, individual and group supervisions, professional indemnity and graduation (in Singapore). The fees do not include Counselling Related Activities.

Course fees are payable in 6 instalments. A registration and administrative fee is payable when you submit your application for the Master of Social Science (Professional Counselling).

The timing of the lessons may vary depending on the nature of the course.

GRADUATION

Students who successfully complete the programme will be awarded the prestigious Master of Social Science (Professional Counselling) degree from Swinburne University of Technology.

Graduation ceremonies for the Master of Social Science (Professional Counselling) are held yearly in Singapore or Melbourne. Graduands who wish to graduate in Australia will have to bear the costs of travel and accommodation.
