INTRODUCTION

The Graduate Certificate of Social Science (Professional Counselling) is a 6-month programme consisting of 4 subject units totalling 182 contact hours.

COURSE AIMS

The Graduate Certificate of Social Science (Professional Counselling) is designed to provide counselling practice and training for professionals involved in mental health and social services as well as those in fields where counselling skills play a primary occupational role.

The course offers a broad approach to counselling with an introduction to practical counselling skills and the processes of counselling. It also provides opportunities for skills acquisition and application. The course is practical in nature and is tailored to help the counselling intern develop an awareness of self and to obtain a well-articulated understanding of the stages of counselling.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

By the end of the course, the counselling intern will be able to:

- gain an understanding of the major counselling approaches;
- (ii) use counselling processes and interventions;
- (iii) develop generic helping skills to manage counselling cases;
- (iv) be aware of professional counselling ethics; and
- (v) grow with individual and group supervision as well as personal therapy.

TEACHING METHODOLOGY

Counselling interns will develop and enhance their counselling skills through an integrated approach based on lectures, role-plays, videotape viewing, small group discussions and clinical supervision.

COURSE FEES

The Course fees and Administrative fees cover Swinburne University of Technology (SUT) online journal, course fees, material fees, individual and group supervision, practicum attachment, professional indemnity, industry wide course fee protection insurance and graduation in Singapore. For Graduate Certificate of Social Science (Professional Counselling), personal counselling fees are included.

CERTIFICATE AWARDED

Counselling interns who successfully complete the 6-month programme will be awarded the Graduate Certificate of Social Science (Professional Counselling).

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Applicants should possess a recognised degree, diploma or appropriate professional qualifications (in areas such as psychology, social work, medicine, nursing or education) or have completed a recognised counselling training at certificate level or have appropriate in-service training in a related discipline. All applicants should demonstrate appropriate motivation and commitment to pursue the course and provide evidence of appropriate opportunities for counselling practice and supervision.

All applicants will be assessed for suitability through:

- (i) an interview;
- submission of an essay of 200 words on why they have chosen to develop their counselling competencies ; and
- (iii) submission of one character reference (the referee should have a good knowledge of the applicant's quality of work and personal suitability for the counselling programme).

Exemptions will be granted where an equivalent postgraduate level subject has been successfully completed at a recognised tertiary institution during the last five years. Recognition of prior learning will be granted where an applicant provides supporting documentary evidence of relevant work experience in the last five years.

No exemptions will be granted after the applicant has received the "Letter of Offer" from Swinburne University of Technology.

INTRODUCTION

The Graduate Diploma of Social Science (Professional Counselling) is a 12-months programme consisting of 8 subjects totalling 432 hours. It incorporates the Graduate Certificate of Social Science (Professional Counselling) (6 months)

COURSE AIMS

The Graduate Diploma of Social Science (Professional Counselling) is designed to develop counselling competencies and provide training for professionals who seek to incorporate advanced counselling skills in their primary occupational role. The aim is to equip our interns with the knowledge skills and dispositions to establish and maintain an effective alliance, with their clients in order to assist them to work through issues and concerns towards making effective changes.

The course will introduce our interns to the major theoretical principles and develop in them an understanding on how these various interventions can be applied in counselling settings. Interns will also learn to competently apply research methodology in a multicultural setting. The course is intended to prepare interns for professional practice as a counsellor in a range of human service organisation.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

By the end of the course, the counselling intern will be able to:

- gain a deeper understanding of the major theoretical approaches;
- (ii) examine professional ethics;
- (iii) undertake research into cross-cutural issues; and
- (iv) develop the knowledge and competencies to manage counselling issues and interventions.

TEACHING METHODOLOGY

Counselling interns will develop and enhance their counselling skills through an integrated approach based on lectures, role-plays, video viewing, small group discussions clinical supervision and counselling facilities experience.



INTRODUCTION

The Master of Social Science (Professional Counselling) is a 24-months programme. It incorporates the Graduate Diploma of Social Science (Professional Counselling) and Graduate Certificate of Social Science (Professional Counselling).

COURSE AIMS

The Master of Social Science (Professional Counselling) is jointly offered by the Swinburne University of Technology and the Executive Counselling and Training Academy. The programe is specifically designed to deepen counselling knowledge mastery and heighten skillsperformance. Apart from keeping abreast of new and emerging counselling theories, our interns will have ample opportunities to explore and analyse advanced intervention models and approaches and apply them in various authentic counselling settings.

The Master of Social Science (Professional Couselling) programme is taught and facilitated by academics with extensive clinical and field experience, and is awarded by the Swinburne University of Technology. The programme which can be completed 24 months provides a professional qualification and is suitable for professionals involved in human resources, health, social services, and education. Professionals who are keen to enhance their communication and listening skills as well as hone further their skills in helping others to grow, will learn to transform their natural talents, abilities and inclinations towards a rewarding professional career.

An integral component of the programme is its 1000 contact hourse, which include 492 lecture contact hours; 23 hours of individual supervision; 39 hours of group supervision; and 100 hours of client counselling during practicum placements.

Other features of the course outside of these contact hours include counselling-related learning, such as clinical experiences at Mount Elizabeth Hospital, observations and activities at Child Guidance Clinic, Institue of Mental Health, Family Service Centres, case note documentation, attendance at conferences and meetings as well as participation in discussions on case management with families, educators, social workers, doctors, psychiatrists and other professionals involved in mental health.

The main objectives of the programme are to ensure the acquisition of an advanced level of knowledge of key counselling approaches; and the development of critical competencies for immediate application in counselling practice.

TEACHING METHODOLOGY

Counselling interns will develop and enhance their counselling skills through an integrated approach based on lectures, role-plays, video viewing, small group discussions and clinical supervision.

CERTIFICATE AWARDED

Counselling interns who successfully complete the programme will be awarded the prestigious Master of Social Science (Professional Counselling) degree from the Swinburne University of Technology, which is equivalent to that awarded to on-campus graduates of the Swinburne University of Technology.

Graduation ceremonies are held in Singapore. Graduates who wish to graduate in Melbourne, Australia will have to bear the expenses for travel accommodation and all other related expenses.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

This programme is an extension of the Graduate Certificate of Social Science (Professional Counselling) and the Graduate Diploma of Social Science (Professional Counselling) that are accredited and awarded by the Swinburne University of Technology.

Applicants may be accepted directly into the Master programme if they have completed a Postgraduate Diploma in Counselling from the recognised university or institution. Exemption may be granted up to a maximum of 50% of the nested suite of courses.

The above criteria will be assessed on a case-to-case basis and will be subject to the Executive Counselling and Training Academy's Board decision and approval by the Swinburne University of Technology.

Selection is based on an interview and the applicant's aptitute for the programme as determined by personal suitability academic qualifications and work experience. Each applicant will be expected to provide:

- (i) evidence of a high standard of performance at the Graduate Diploma level;
- (ii) one character referee (the referee should have good knowledge on the applicant's quality of work and personal suitability for the counselling programme);
- (iii) evidence of appropriate supervised counselling experience; and
- (iv) a written statement of 200 words of his/her reasons for wanting to develop his/her counselling competencies.

"Hope, Healing and Restoration"

Hope: ECTA aspires to instil hope to its students, providing them an opportunity to fulfil their dreams and passion. Through the training offered, students and graduates in return instil hope in their clients.

Healing: The education process that is offered at ECTA enable students to heal old wounds; this process equips students to experience the healing power from within and to enable their clients a similar experience in their counselling sessions.

Restoration: In order to achieve better well-being, ECTA believes that restoration to one's physical, spiritual, psychological and emotional well-being is the key for holistic growth.

Sunflowers are viewed as a symbol of loyalty and constancy. It is always standing tall and facing the sun. No matter where they are planted, sunflowers turn toward the sun. Their heads literally follow the sun across the sky and when the sun sets, it droops only to look up again the next day to follow the sun. Its petals have been said to resemble the rays of the sun which evokes feelings of warmth and happiness. In addition, the sunflowers' unique ability to provide energy in a similar form as the sun – nourishment and vibrancy parallels very closely to what counsellors do – provide positive energy in the form of hope, healing and restoration.



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
